In light of the outbreak of Coronavirus (COVID-19), we are writing today to let you know about the approach that Camp Lau-Ren is taking to keep our campers safe and healthy at camp.

At this time, Canadian public health authorities have assessed the risk associated with COVID-19 to those in Canada as low.

In order to ensure a safe experience for everyone at Camp Lau-Ren, we are monitoring the issue carefully and will continue to do so. We have consulted with our local public health unit, the Renfrew County and District Health Unit, and we are working with the Ontario Camps Association to ensure we are following best practices. We will continue to look to both the experts in Public Health and the Ontario Camps Association guidance for the most up to date information.

Our well-established health-specific protocols under the guidance of our Executive Directors, Ron & Joanne Hartnett, are in place to protect our campers and staff. Ron is a Public Health Inspector with the Renfrew County and District Health Unit and is monitoring the situation.

At this time, there are no changes necessary to any of our procedures as we prepare for the camp season ahead. Should any of this change, we will communicate this with you as early as possible.

If the camp is forced to close because of COVID-19, refunds will be provided to registered campers, less an administration fee. If the camp remains open and a parent/guardian decides to withdraw their child from the camp, there will be no refund.
